This week...

Reader's workshop: This week in Reader's workshop we made goals for ourselves as readers. Students chose their own goal and made a plan to reach their goal. For example, if a child's goal was to "scoop up more words" (fluency) their plan was to read through the entire line, in one breath, until they saw the punctuation mark. Students held each other accountable by meeting with their same book partner to discuss their goals.

Writer's workshop: This week in writer's workshop we started our new unit on poetry. Students learned they can view ordinary objects in a different way. One student compared an eraser to a magician because they both make things disappear. I look forward to starting poetry books with the students next week.

Math: This week in math we learned about two-step word problems. Students learned the importance of reading through the entire problem and organizing our thinking by setting up two equations with two number lines.

Guidance: we read "The Invisible Boy" and discussed how people can feel invisible when we do certain things (getting picked last at kickball, seeing friends tell secrets, not being invited to a birthday party, etc.). Students wrote down when they have felt invisible. We wrote messages to their experiences to make them feel empowered.
